Who was Elisabeth Lange?

Elisabeth Lange lived in our neighbourhood. She was friends with a Jewish family. This was dangerous in the days of National Socialism, because Jews were persecuted.

Elisabeth Lange did not approve of National Socialism. She did not lose touch with her friends. This is why she was brought to the Fuhlsbüttel concentration camp. She died there.

Elisabeth Lange was **COURAGEOUS**, had a **HEART** and lived **TOLLERANTLY**. She is our example.
